

Holiday Tourney To Open Dec. 27

In the opening game at 7:30 Thursday, Dec. 27, Byron will play Pecatonica. In the 9 o'clock game that evening Winnebago and Durand will clash.

The losers of these games will play for consolation honors at 7:30 on Friday night, Dec. 28, while the winners will battle for the championship at 9 o'clock on the same night.

Pecatonica is the defending champion. To date Byron has a 4-1 record, Winnebago has a 3-1 record and Durand has a 2-3 record while Pecatonica has lost all of its season's games.






Jim Wachlin of Lena won the 220-yard dash in :25.2 and the 100 yard dash in :11.1, which tied the record set by Dickerson of Durant


